### [When Science Meets Art: Moonwalk MashUp](#)

TODAY, Wednesday, May 4,  
7-9pm, [Museum of Science](#),  
One Science Park, Boston. \$15.

A three-part evening celebrating our love affair with the galaxy. First, encounter Clea T. Waite's *Moonwalk*, an experimental film designed specifically for full-dome planetariums. The rough cut received the IBM Innovation Prize at the 2007 Boston Cyberarts Festival-now we premiere the finished film in the new Planetarium. Next, journey farther out through a cosmic story slam: What will galactic life be like in the future? What does an alien abduction feel like? Why is gazing at the stars so alluring? The evening wraps up with a cosmic cocktail reception, where you can show off your inspired space-wear or

high-tech fashions.

Prizes for audience favorite stories and costumes will be awarded.

## [Voices Without Races: An Audio Journey](#)

TODAY, Wednesday, May 4-June 5, [Museum of Science](#), One Science Park, Boston. Admission Fee.

Sound artist Halsey Burgund and the Museum of Science collected the voices of more than 250 people who live in towns along the Route 28 corridor and created a compelling audio scape of personal stories that reveals how we are all different and yet the same.

To organize the world around us, we use broad strokes to label people and places, often relying on stereotypes. These simplifications stand in marked contrast to the rich and complex ways in which we identify ourselves, our neighborhoods, and our hometowns. Boston's long history of diversity and change is unknown to many and often overshadowed by well-known periods of racial tension and conflict.

Today, the Greater Boston area is home to a wealth of ethnicities and cultures, a vivid tapestry exemplified in the neighborhoods along Route 28, which stretches from countryside in the north, through suburbs and manufacturing towns, past the Museum and through the heart of Boston, and down to Cape Cod.
